

- Do not insert objects of any kind into the cabinet slots, as they may touch dangerous voltage points, which can be harmful or fatal or may cause electric shock, fire or equipment failure.

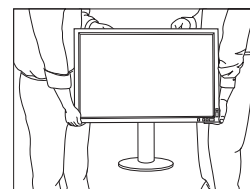


Image Persistence: Image persistence is when a residual or “ghost” image of a previous image remains visible on the screen. Unlike CRT monitors, LCD monitors’ image persistence is not permanent, but constant images being displayed for a long period of time should be avoided.

To alleviate image persistence, turn off the monitor for as long as the previous image was displayed. For example, if an image was on the monitor for one hour and a residual image remains, the monitor should be turned off for one hour to erase the image.

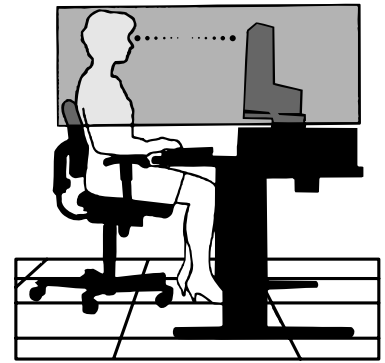
NOTE: As with all personal display devices, NEC DISPLAY SOLUTIONS recommends using a moving screen saver at regular intervals whenever the screen is idle or turning off the monitor when not in use.



**CORRECT PLACEMENT AND ADJUSTMENT OF THE MONITOR CAN
REDUCE EYE, SHOULDER AND NECK FATIGUE. CHECK THE
FOLLOWING WHEN YOU POSITION THE MONITOR:**



- For optimum performance, allow 20 minutes for the display to warm up.
- Adjust the monitor height so that the top of the screen is at or slightly below eye level. Your eyes should look slightly downward when viewing the middle of the screen.
- Position your monitor no closer than 40 cm (15.75 inches) and no further away than 70 cm (27.56 inches) from your eyes. The optimal distance is 50 cm (19.69 inches).
- Rest your eyes periodically by focusing on an object at least 20 feet away. Blink often.
- Position the monitor at a 90° angle to windows and other light sources to minimize glare and reflections. Adjust the monitor tilt so that ceiling lights do not reflect on your screen.
- If reflected light makes it hard for you to see your screen, use an anti-glare filter.
- Clean the LCD monitor surface with a lint-free, non-abrasive cloth. Avoid using any cleaning solution or glass cleaner!
- Adjust the monitor's brightness controls to enhance readability.
- Use a document holder placed close to the screen.
- Position whatever you are looking at most of the time (the screen or reference material) directly in front of you to minimize turning your head while you are typing.
- Avoid displaying fixed patterns on the monitor for long periods of time to avoid image persistence (after-image effects).
- Get regular eye checkups.



Ergonomics

To realize the maximum ergonomics benefits, we recommend the following:

- To avoid eye fatigue, adjust the brightness to a moderate setting. Place a sheet of white paper next to the LCD screen for luminance reference.
- Use the preset Size and Position controls with standard signals.
- Use the preset Color Setting.
- Use non-interlaced signals with a vertical refresh rate of more than 60 Hz.
- Do not use primary color blue on a dark background, as it is difficult to see and may produce eye fatigue due to insufficient contrast.
- Suitable for entertainment purposes at controlled luminous environments, to avoid disturbing reflections from the screen.

Cleaning the LCD Panel

- When the LCD is dusty, please gently wipe with a soft cloth.
- Please do not rub the LCD panel with hard or coarse material.
- Please do not apply pressure to the LCD surface.
- Please do not use OA cleaner as it will cause deterioration or discoloration on the LCD surface.

Cleaning the Cabinet

- Unplug the power supply
- Gently wipe the cabinet with a soft cloth
- To clean the cabinet, dampen the cloth with a neutral detergent and water, wipe the cabinet and follow with a dry cloth.

NOTE: Many plastics are used on the surface of the cabinet. DO NOT clean with benzene, thinner, alkaline detergent, alcoholic system detergent, glass cleaner, wax, polish cleaner, soap powder, or insecticide. Do not touch rubber or vinyl to the cabinet for a long time. These types of fluids and fabrics can cause the paint to deteriorate, crack or peel.

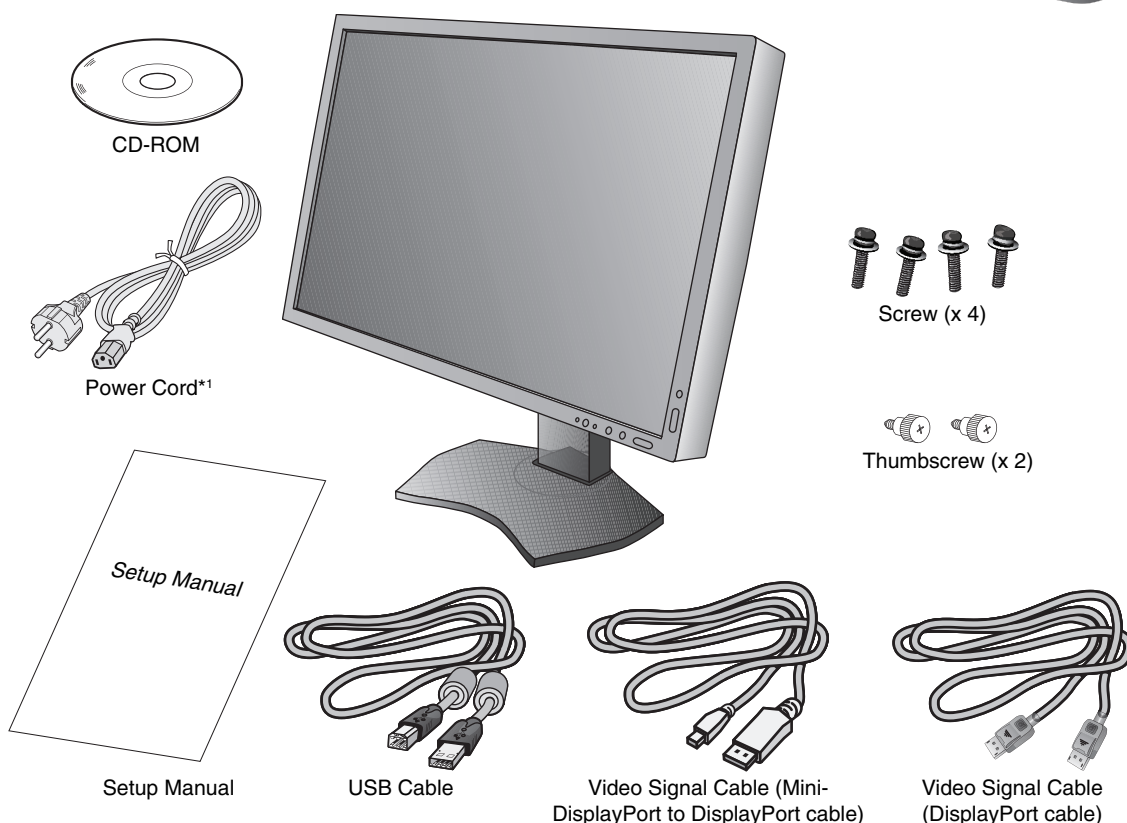

Quick Start

To connect the LCD monitor to your system, follow these instructions:

NOTE: Make sure to read “Recommended Use” (page 3) before installation.
In order to display the maximum resolution, a display card that can output a resolution of 3840 x 2160 is needed.
The monitor must be installed or carried by two or more people.

1. Turn off the power to your computer.
2. **For a PC or MAC with DVI digital output:** Connect the Dual Link DVI signal cable to the connector of the display card in your system (**Figure A.1**). Tighten all screws.

For a PC with DisplayPort output: Connect the DisplayPort cable to the connector of the display card in your system (**Figure A.2**).

For a PC with HDMI output: Connect the HDMI cable to the connector of the display card in your system (**Figure A.3**).

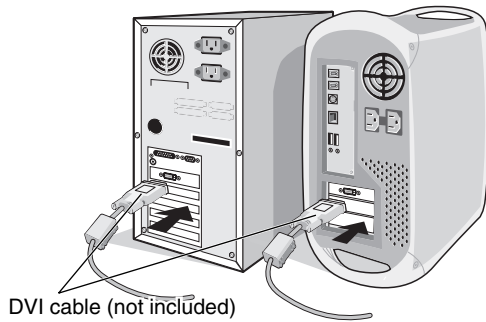

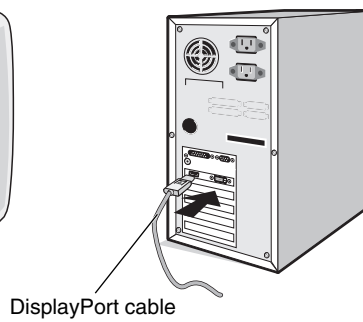

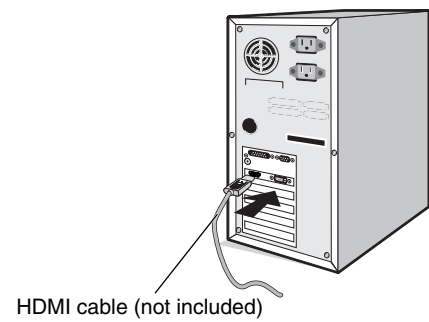

- NOTE:**
1. Please use a DisplayPort cable with a DisplayPort logo.
 2. When removing the DisplayPort cable, hold down the top button to release the lock.
3. Height adjustment is locked by lock button. Place hand on top of the monitor to push down the screen to the lowest position. Slide the lock button to unlock the stand to raise the monitor head (**Figure B.1**).

NOTE: Handle with care when unlocking stand.

Place hands on each side of the monitor to tilt the LCD panel 30-degree angle and lift up to the highest position.
Slide the cable cover up (**Figure B.2**).

NOTE: Cable cover is not removable.

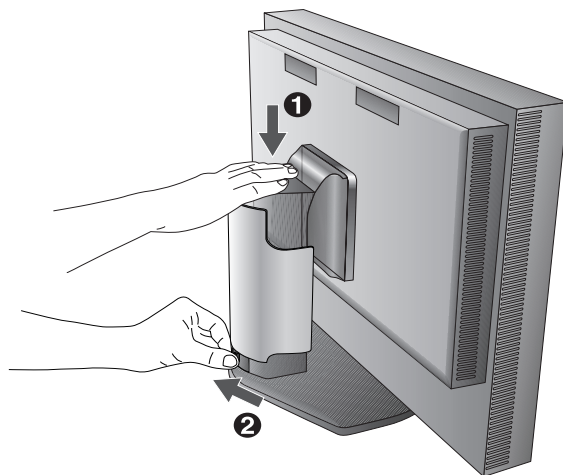

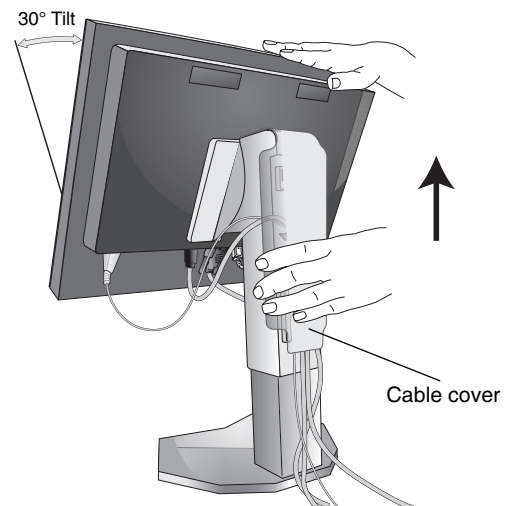

4. Connect all cables to the appropriate connectors (**Figure C.1**). When using the USB cable, connect the B type connector to the USB upstream port on the right back side of the monitor and the A type connector to the downstream port on the computer (**Figure C.1a**). If using the cord from a USB device, plug into one of the downstream ports of the monitor.

NOTE: Incorrect cable connections may result in irregular operation, damage display quality/components of LCD module and/or shorten the module's life.

NOTE: When you use DVI signal, please select DVI in HDMI/DVI SELECT in Advanced Menu Tag9 or on NO SIGNAL OSD warning (see page 18).

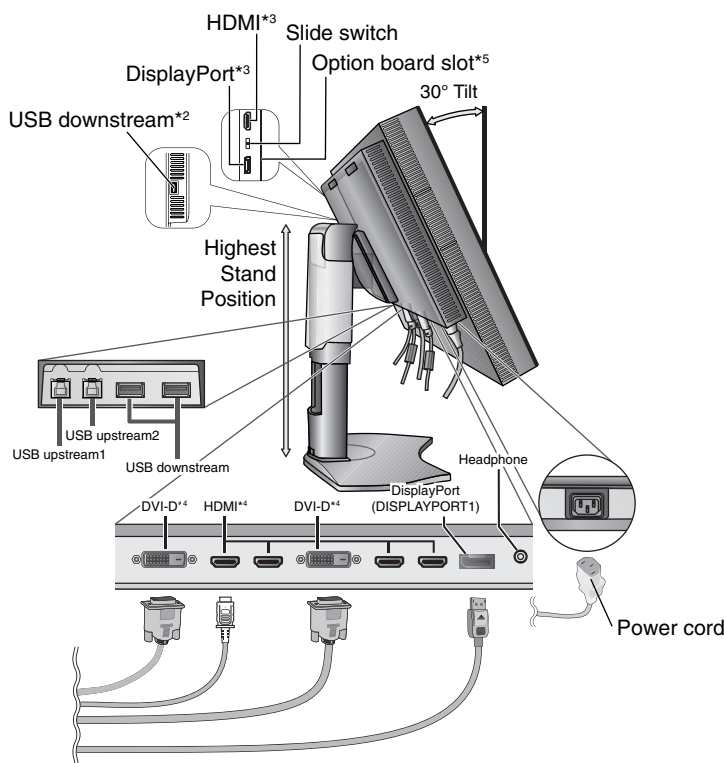

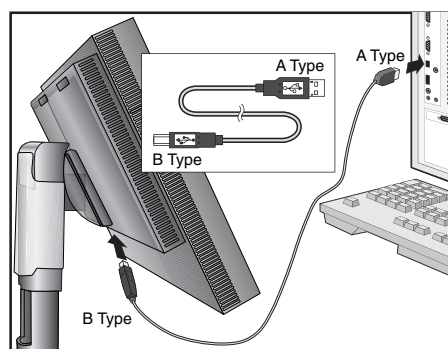

5. To keep the cables neatly organized, place them into the cable management system that is built into the stand. Place the cables in the hooks firmly and evenly (**Figure C.2** and **Figure C.3**).
6. Please check that you can still rotate, raise and lower the monitor screen when you have installed the cables.

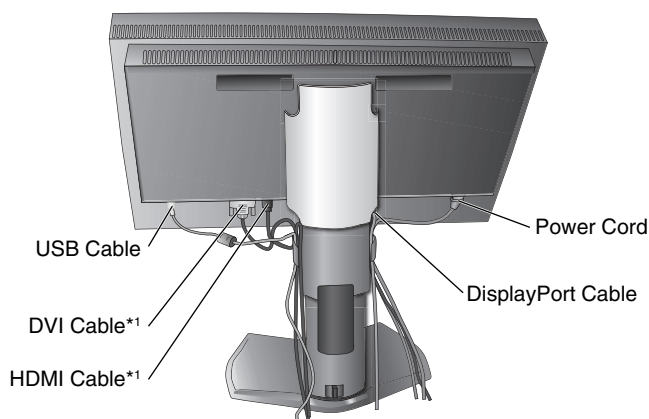

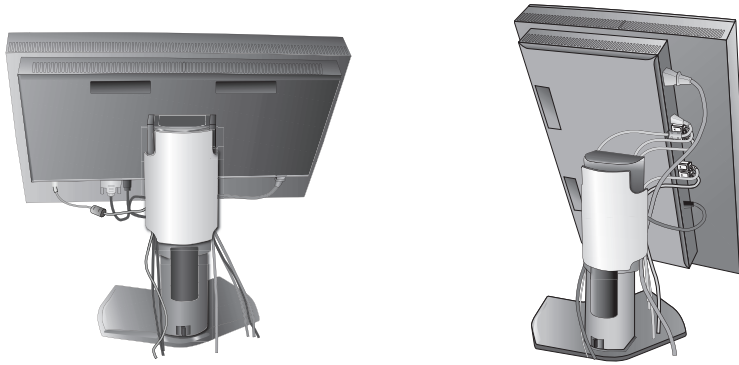

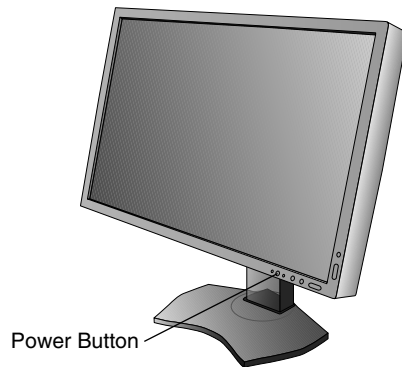

Raise and Lower the Monitor Screen

The monitor may be raised or lowered in Landscape mode.

To raise or lower screen, place hands on each side of the monitor and lift or lower to the desired height (**Figure RL.1**).

NOTE: Handle with care when raising or lowering the monitor screen.

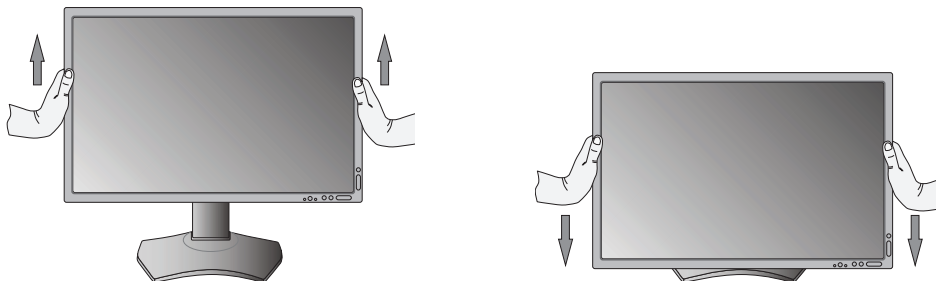

Screen Rotation

Before rotating, the screen must be raised to the highest level and tilt to avoid knocking the screen on the desk or pinching your fingers. Disconnect all cables.

To raise the screen, place hands on each side of the monitor and lift up to the highest position (**Figure RL.1**).

To rotate screen, place hands on each side of the monitor screen and turn clockwise from Landscape to Portrait or counter-clockwise from Portrait to Landscape (**Figure R.1**).

To rotate OSD menu between landscape and portrait, refer to “Controls” section.

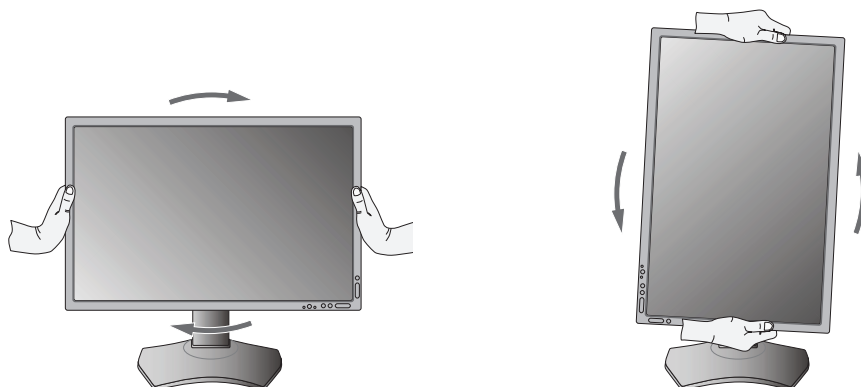

Tilt

Grasp top and bottom sides of the monitor screen with your hands and adjust the tilt as desired (**Figure TS.1**).

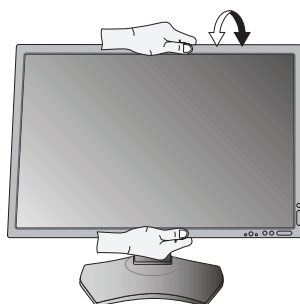

Flexible Arm Installation

This LCD monitor is designed for use with a flexible arm.

To prepare the monitor for alternate mounting purposes:

NOTE: The monitor must be installed or moved by two or more people.

- Follow the instructions provided by the manufacturer of the display mount.
- To meet the safety requirements, the monitor must be mounted to an arm that supports the weight of the monitor. See page 27 for details. Remove the monitor stand before mounting.

Remove Monitor Stand for Mounting

To prepare the monitor for alternate mounting purposes:

1. Disconnect all cables.
2. Place hands on each side of the monitor and lift up to the highest position.
3. Place monitor face down on a non-abrasive surface (**Figure S.1**).
4. Place one hand around the base and one hand on the Quick Release Lever. Push and hold the Quick Release Lever in the direction indicated by the arrows (**Figure S.1**).
5. Lift up the stand to unhook it from the monitor (**Figure S.1**). The monitor can now be mounted using an alternate method. Reverse the process to reattach stand.

NOTE: Handle with care when removing monitor stand.

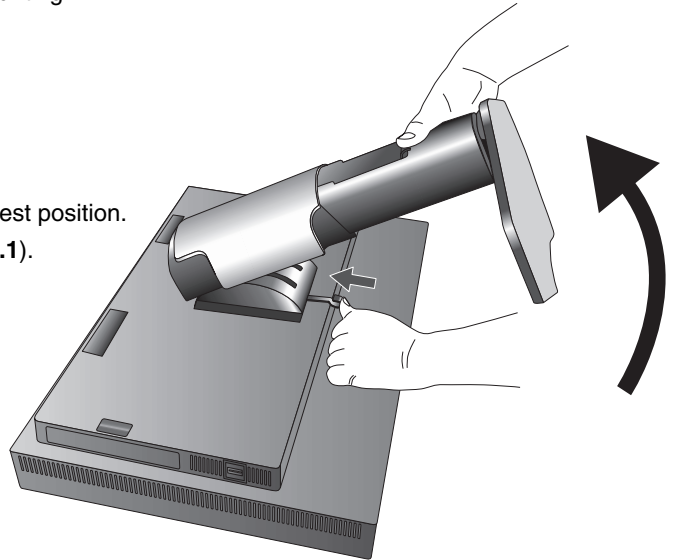


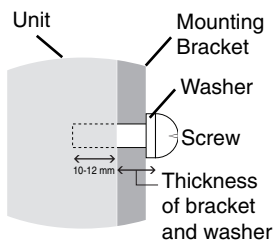

Mount the Flexible arm

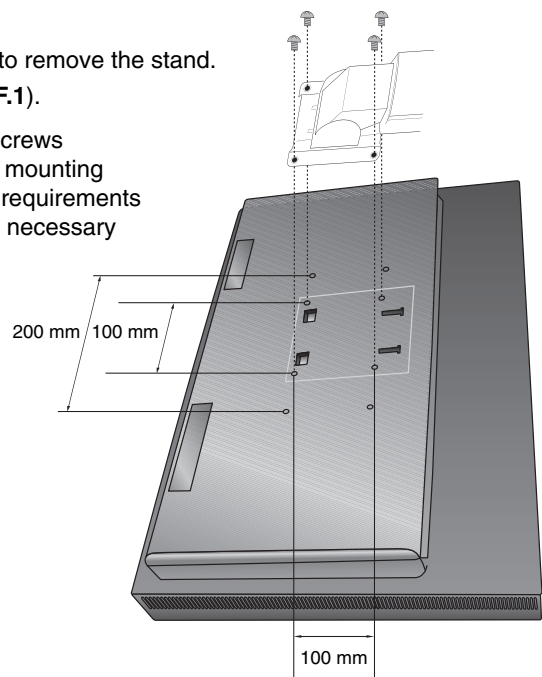
This LCD monitor is designed for use with a flexible arm.

1. Follow the instructions on how Remove Monitor Stand for Mounting to remove the stand.
2. Using the attached 4 screws, attach the arm to the monitor (**Figure F.1**).

Caution: Use ONLY the screws (4 pcs) that are included or M4 sized screws (Length: thickness of bracket and washer + 10-12 mm) when mounting to avoid damage to the monitor and stand. To fulfil the safety requirements the monitor must be mounted to an arm which guaranties the necessary stability under consideration of the weight of the monitor. The LCD monitor should only be used with an approved arm (e.g. TUEV GS mark).

2. Connect attached thumbscrews to the holes on the HDMI and DisplayPort Input Card (**Figure G.1**).

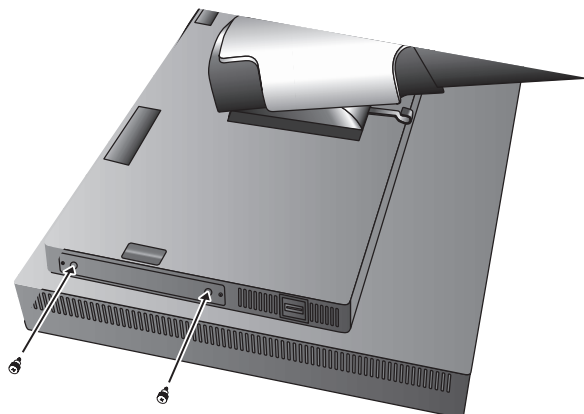

Controls

Many of the OSD controls are also available in the included MultiProfiler software, developed by NEC Display Solutions. The latest MultiProfiler software is available on the NEC Display Solutions website.

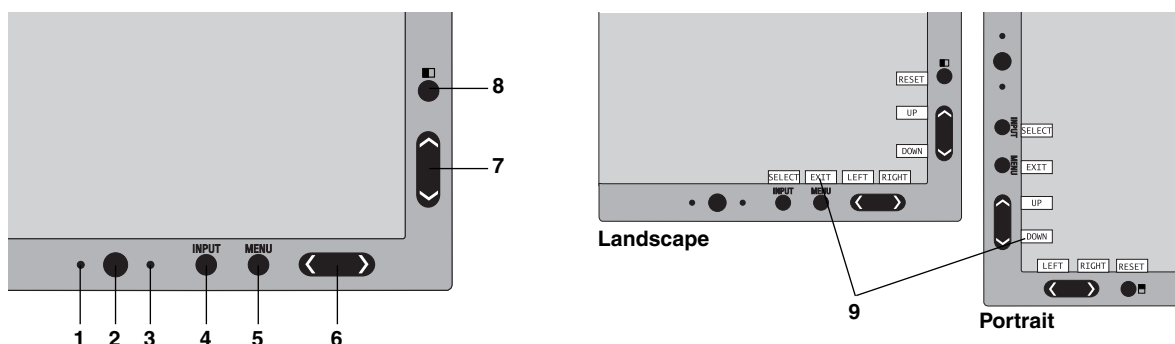
NOTE: Depending the option board which you use, some OSD function may not be activated.

OSD (On-Screen Display) control buttons on the front of the monitor function as follows:

To access OSD menu, press the MENU button.

To change signal input, press the SELECT button.

NOTE: OSD must be closed in order to change signal input.



1 AMBIENT LIGHT SENSOR	Detects the level of ambient lighting allowing the monitor to make adjustments to various settings resulting in a more comfortable viewing experience. Do not cover this sensor.
2 Power	Turns the monitor on and off.
3 LED	Indicates that the power is on. Can be changed between blue and green in the Advanced OSD menu.
4 INPUT/SELECT	Enters the OSD Control menu. Enters OSD sub menus. Changes the input source when not in the OSD Control menu. NOTE: HDMI or DVI signal are not changed by INPUT button. You need to set HDMI/DVI in Advanced Menu Tag9. Hold the button to show USB selection menu when not in the OSD Control menu* ¹ . NOTE: This USB selection setting back to the current setting by OSD menu when you change input signal or turn off the monitor.
5 MENU/EXIT	Access OSD menu. Exits the OSD sub menu. Exits OSD Control menu.
6 LEFT/RIGHT	Navigates to the left or right through the OSD Control menu. You can adjust the volume directly, while the OSD menu is off* ¹ .
7 UP/DOWN	Navigates up or down through the OSD Control menu. Show PICTURE MODE menu when not in the OSD Control menu* ¹ , * ² .
8 RESET/PIP	Resets the OSD back to factory settings in the OSD control menu. PIP can be selected when the OSD is not showing* ³ . Hold the button to show ECO MODE menu while the OSD menu is off* ¹ .
9 KEY GUIDE	The Key Guide appears on screen when the OSD control menu is accessed. The Key Guide will rotate when the OSD control menu is rotated*.

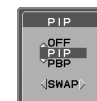

Press the UP/DOWN button to select PICTURE MODE in ACTIVE PICTURE. In PIP or PBP (Picture by Picture) mode, press LEFT/RIGHT button to change ACTIVE PICTURE. Picture mode can be selected for ACTIVE PICTURE independently.

Press the UP/DOWN button to change MULTI PICTURE setting. Press the LEFT/RIGHT button to SWAP when you select PIP in MULTI PICTURE.



SETTING OSD LANGUAGE

- Use the control buttons (LEFT/RIGHT or UP/DOWN or MENU) to access the “LANGUAGE SELECTION” menu.
- Press the LEFT/RIGHT or UP/DOWN buttons to select the desired OSD language.
- To exit from this OSD menu, press EXIT button.

NOTE: Setting the OSD language is only necessary upon initial setup. The OSD language will stay the same until changed by the user.



Brightness Controls

BRIGHTNESS

Adjusts the overall image and background screen brightness.

NOTE: The brightness level is adjusted using the backlight output.

The display will digitally compensate for low or high brightness levels.

If digital compensation occurs, the brightness value on the OSD will change to magenta.

NOTE: The optimal display performance will be in the range where the OSD brightness value is black. When the display cannot achieve the desired brightness, the numerical brightness value on the OSD will blink.

NOTE: For low brightness settings, the display will automatically compensate by adjusting the screen contrast to achieve the desired brightness. This will result in a reduced contrast ratio and the OSD indicator will change to magenta.

NOTE: For high brightness settings, the display will automatically compensate by turning down uniformity compensation in order to achieve the desired brightness. The OSD indicator will change to magenta and this may result in decreased uniformity.

ECO MODE

Decreases the amount of power consumed by reducing the brightness level.

OFF: No function.

MODE1: Reduces the maximum possible brightness to about 200 cd/m².

MODE2: Reduces the maximum possible brightness to about 100 cd/m².

BLACK

Adjusts the black luminance.

When low settings are selected that cannot be displayed, the indicator on the OSD will turn magenta.



Image Controls

LEFT / RIGHT

Controls Horizontal Image Position within the display area of the LCD.

DOWN / UP

Controls Vertical Image Position within the display area of the LCD.

EXPANSION

Sets the zoom method.

FULL: The image is expanded to full screen, regardless of the resolution.

ASPECT: The image is expanded without changing the aspect ratio.

OFF: The image is not expanded.

CUSTOM: Refer to the Advanced OSD menu for detailed instructions.

NOTE: When image is rotated, depending on the signal resolution, characters and lines may be blurred.

SHARPNESS

This function is digitally capable of keeping crisp image at any time. It is continuously adjustable to get as distinct or as soft an image as your prefer and set independently by different timings.

UHD UPSCALING

When using a low resolution signal, the amount of upscaling to a high resolution signal can be selected.



Color Control Systems

PICTURE MODE

Changes the Picture mode that is most suitable for the type of content that is shown. 5 Picture modes are available to be customized. See Advanced menu Tag1 PICTURE MODE (page 20) and "Using the PICTURE MODE function" (page 19) for more information.

WHITE

Adjusts the white temperature to NATIVE or a specific color temperature using this setting. A lower color temperature will make the screen reddish and a higher color temperature will make the screen bluish. NATIVE is a default color temperature of LCD panel. 6500K is recommended for general graphic design and 5000K is recommended for print matching.

ADJUST

HUE: Adjusts the hue of each color*1. The change in color will appear on screen and the menu color bars will show the amount of adjustment.

OFFSET: Adjusts the color brightness of each color*1. Press "RIGHT" button and the color brightness increases.

SATURATION: Adjusts the color depth of each color*1. Press the "RIGHT" button and the color vividness increases.

WHITE (White Balance): If TEMPERATURE needs further adjustment, the individual R/G/B levels of the white point can be adjusted. To adjust the R/G/B levels, CUSTOM must be showing as the TEMPERATURE selection.

*1: RED, YELLOW, GREEN, CYAN, BLUE and MAGENTA.

ADVANCED SETTING

Shows the ADVANCED MENU. See page 20 for detailed information. Set PICTURE MODE in detail in Advanced menu Tag1.



Tools

VOLUME

Controls the volume of the speakers or headphones when set to other than OFF in MULTI PICTURE. To mute the sound output, press the "RESET" button.

SOUND INPUT

Selects the sound input port when set to other than OFF in MULTI PICTURE. A red frame is displayed on selected picture when you are in this function.

NOTE: When you select "DVI", the speakers will not emit any sound.

MULTI PICTURE

Selects MULTI PICTURE MODE, OFF/PIP/PBP (Picture by Picture).

NOTE: HDMI signal and DVI signal are not shown in PIP and PBP (Picture by Picture). Please select HDMI/DVI SELECT in Advanced Menu Tag9.

PICTURE PATTERN

Selects split screen mode when MULTI PICTURE is "PBP". You can select 2 or 4 picture split screen types.

ACTIVE PICTURE

Selects active picture when set to other than OFF in MULTI PICTURE. A white frame is displayed on selected picture while OSD menu is displayed.




USB SELECT

Change USB upstream input (1 or 2) associated with the current display input. When connecting a computer to each of the upstream ports, the monitor's USB downstream ports can be used by selecting this setting for the current input signal.

You can change the active display and upstream USB port combination by using the Input button (see page 13).

You can set the USB selection for each input signals in Advanced menu (see page 23).

When using only one upstream port, the connected upstream port is used by default.

NOTE: To avoid data loss, before changing USB upstream ports, ensure that no USB storage devices are in use by the operating system of the computer attached to the USB upstream port.

VIDEO DETECT

Selects the method of video detection when more than one video input is connected for active picture.

FIRST: When current video input signal is not present, then the monitor searches for a video signal from the other video input port(s)*3. If a video signal is present in another port, then the monitor switches the video source input port to the new found video source automatically. The monitor will not look for other video signals while the current video source is present.

LAST: When the monitor is displaying a signal from the current source and a new secondary source is supplied to the monitor, then the monitor will automatically switch to the new video source. When current video input signal is not present, then the monitor searches for a video signal from the other video input port(s)*3. If the video signal is present in another port, then the monitor switches the video source input port to the new found video source automatically.

NONE: The Monitor will not search the other video input port unless the monitor is turned on.

NOTE: When HDMI1 or DVI1 is set, HDMI and DisplayPort Input Card signal (OPTION) detection is not available.

When HDMI and DisplayPort Input Card input (OPTION) is set, HDMI1 or DVI1 detection is not available.

When HDMI and DisplayPort Input Card input (OPTION) is set, LAST may not work.

*3 When HDMI1, DVI1 or HDMI and DisplayPort (OPTION) is set, this function may not work.

OFF TIMER

Monitor will automatically power-down when you have selected a pre-determined amount of time.

Before powering off, a message will appear on the screen asking if you want to delay the turn off time by 60 minutes. Press any OSD button to delay the power-down time.

OFF MODE

The Intelligent Power Manager allows the monitor to enter into a power saving mode after a period of inactivity. The OFF MODE has four settings.

OFF: Monitor does not go into power save mode when the input signal is lost.

STANDARD: Monitor enters power save mode automatically when the input signal is lost.

NOTE: OPTION signal image does not reappear when the signal is restarted.

ADVANCED: The signal detection circuit works always. Recovery time to normal mode is faster than STANDARD. Power consumption is slightly higher than STANDARD.

NOTE: When set to STANDARD, if the image does not reappear when the signal is restarted, please change the setting to ADVANCED.

When there are signal inputs from both DVI and HDMI connectors, Intelligent Power Manager may not work properly.

OPTION: Monitor enters power save mode automatically when the amount of surrounding light goes below the level that is determined by the user. The level can be adjusted in OFF MODE SETTING in Tag 6 of the Advanced OSD menu.

When in power save mode, the LED on the front of the monitor blinks amber. While in power save mode, push any of the front buttons, except for POWER and SELECT to return to normal.

When the amount of surrounding light returns to normal levels, the monitor will automatically return to normal mode.



MENU Tools

LANGUAGE

OSD control menus are available in nine languages.

OSD LEFT/RIGHT

You can choose where you would like the OSD control image to appear on your screen. Selecting OSD Location allows you to manually adjust the position of the OSD control menu left or right.

OSD DOWN/UP

You can choose where you would like the OSD control image to appear on your screen. Selecting OSD Location allows you to manually adjust the position of the OSD control menu Up or Down.

OSD TURN OFF

The OSD control menu will stay on as long as it is use. You can select how long the monitor waits after the last touch of a button to shut off the OSD control menu. The preset choices are 10-120 seconds by 5-second increments.

OSD LOCK OUT

This control completely locks out access to all OSD control functions. When attempting to activate OSD controls while in the Lock Out mode, a screen will appear indicating the OSD controls are locked out.

There are three types of OSD LOCK OUT:

OSD LOCK OUT with no control: To activate the OSD Lock Out function, press SELECT, then "RIGHT" button and hold down simultaneously. To deactivate the OSD Lock Out, press SELECT, then "RIGHT" button and hold down simultaneously while in the OSD menu. No controls can be adjusted while in the lock out mode.

OSD LOCK OUT with BRIGHTNESS and VOLUME control: To activate the OSD Lock Out function, press SELECT, then "DOWN" and "LEFT" buttons and hold down simultaneously. To deactivate the OSD Lock Out, press SELECT, then "DOWN" and "LEFT" buttons and hold down simultaneously while in the OSD menu. BRIGHTNESS and VOLUME can be adjusted while in this lock out mode.

CUSTOM: Refer to the Advanced OSD Menu.

OSD TRANSPARENCY

Adjusts the transparency of the OSD Menu.

OSD COLOR

Adjusts the color of the OSD Menu. "Tag window frame color", "Item select color" and "Adjust window frame color" can be changed to Red, Green, Blue, or Gray.

RESOLUTION NOTIFIER

If ON is selected, a message will appear on the screen after 30 seconds, notifying you that the resolution is not the optimal resolution.

HOT KEY

You can adjust the VOLUME directly. When this function is set to ON, you can adjust the VOLUME with "LEFT" or "RIGHT", while the OSD menu is off. The standard OSD can be accessed with the EXIT button. When this function is set to OFF, some buttons are disabled (see page 13).

FACTORY PRESET

Selecting FACTORY PRESET allows you to reset all OSD control settings (except VIDEO DETECT, LANGUAGE, OSD LOCK OUT, OSD COLOR, RESOLUTION NOTIFIER, HOT KEY) back to the factory settings. Individual settings can be reset by highlighting the control to be reset and pressing the RESET button.

NOTE: If you want reset to include the Picture calibration settings and SELF COLOR CORRECTION settings, please use FACTORY PRESET in Advanced OSD menu (see page 24).



ECO Information

CARBON SAVINGS: Displays the estimated carbon savings information in kg.

CARBON USAGE: Displays the estimated carbon usages information in kg.

This is the arithmetic estimation, not actual measurement value.

This estimation is based without any options.

COST SAVINGS: Displays the electricity cost savings in balance.

CARBON CONVERT SETTING: Adjusts the carbon footprint factor in the carbon saving calculation. This initial setting is based on the OECD (2008 Edition).

CURRENCY SETTING: Displays electricity pricing in 6 currency units.

CURRENCY CONVERT SETTING: Displays electricity savings in kW/hour (US Currency is default).

NOTE: This model's initial setting is "Currency = US\$" and its Currency Convert setting = \$0.11.

This setting can be changed by using the ECO information menu.

If you want to use the French setting, please refer to steps below:

1. Open menu by pressing the Menu button and select the ECO information menu using the "LEFT" or "RIGHT" button.
2. Select CURRENCY SETTING item pressing the "UP" or "DOWN" button.

Information

Provides information about the current resolution display (Main picture), current USB input setting and technical data including the preset timing being used and the horizontal and vertical frequencies. Indicates the model and serial numbers of your monitor.

OSD Warning

OSD Warning menus disappear with EXIT button.

NO SIGNAL: This function gives a warning when there is no Horizontal or Vertical Sync. After power is turned on or when there is a change of input signal, the **No Signal** window will appear. You can set 4 OSD menus, OFF MODE (see page 17), DIGITAL LONG CABLE (see page 22), VIDEO DETECT (see page 23) and HDMI/DVI SELECT (see page 25).

RESOLUTION NOTIFIER: This function warns if resolution other than the optimized resolution is used. After power is turned on or when there is a change of input signal or the video signal doesn't have proper resolution, the **Resolution Notifier** window will open. This function can be disabled in the MENU Tools.

OUT OF RANGE: This function gives a recommendation of the optimized resolution and refresh rate. After the power is turned on or there is a change of input signal or if the video signal doesn't have proper timing, the **Out Of Range** menu will appear.

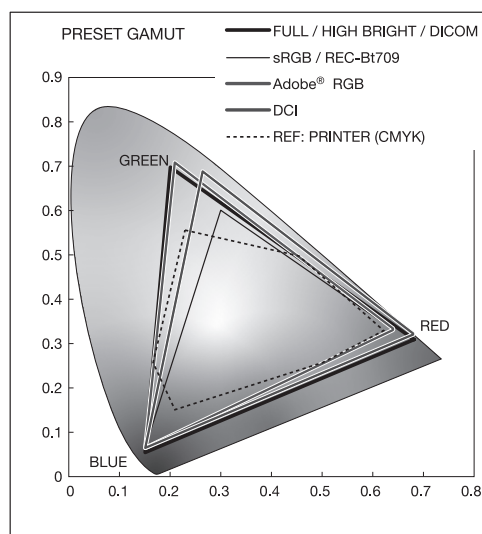
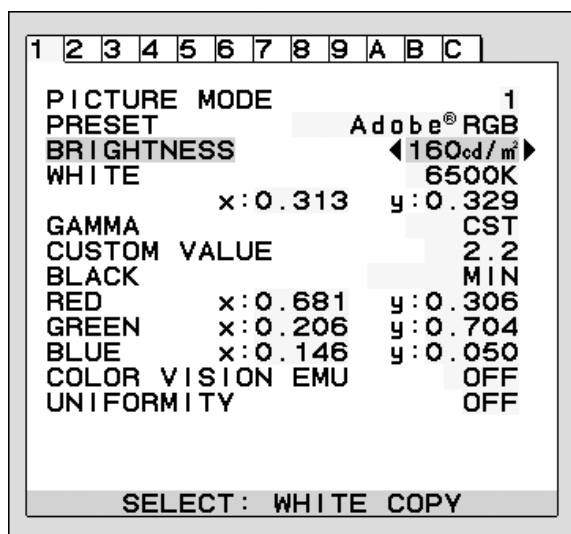

- Check the DVI cable you use. If input resolution is 1920 x 2160 or 3840 x 2160, DVI Dual Link cable needs to be used.
- Depending on HDCP 2.2 contents limitation, some HDMI signal may not be displayed. Please connect to the HDMI connector on the HDMI and DisplayPort Input Card.
- Check VIDEO DETECT. It may need to be set to OPTION, HDMI1 or DVI1 via the INPUT button (see page 16).

Power Button does not respond

- Unplug the power cord of the monitor from the AC outlet to turn off and reset the monitor.

Image Persistence

- Image persistence is when a residual or "ghost" image of a previous image remains visible on the screen. Unlike CRT monitors, LCD monitors' image persistence is not permanent, but constant images being displayed for a long period of time should be avoided. To alleviate image persistence, turn off the monitor for as long as the previous image was displayed. For example, if an image was on the monitor for one hour and a residual image remains, the monitor should be turned off for one hour to erase the image.

NOTE: As with all personal display devices, NEC DISPLAY SOLUTIONS recommends using a moving screen saver at regular intervals whenever the screen is idle or turning off the monitor when not in use.

Picture is discolored

- Make sure COLOR VISION EMU is OFF.
- Make sure PICTURE MODE setting is the same as ICC profile on PC.
- Set SELF COLOR CORRECTION.
- First, use the front POWER button to turn off the monitor. Then use the POWER button turn the monitor on while holding RESET (PIP) and SELECT (INPUT) buttons at the same time. This will reset all color parameters to the factory setting. This reset will take about 10 seconds and then the factory settings screen is displayed.

Color irregularities on screen

- Reduce BRIGHTNESS.
- Set UNIFORMITY to "5".

Moving image is not smooth

- When using a DVD player or any other type of high-definition device, consult the User's Manual included with the device for detailed information on changing the signal from interlaced to progressive.
- Set RESPONSE IMPROVE to ON.

Message "OUT OF RANGE" is displayed (screen is either blank or shows rough images only)

- Image is displayed only roughly (pixels are missing) and OSD warning "OUT OF RANGE" is displayed: Either signal clock or resolution is too high. Choose one of the supported modes.
- OSD warning "OUT OF RANGE" is displayed on a blank screen: Signal frequency is out of range. Choose one of the supported modes.

Image is unstable, unfocused or swimming is apparent

- Signal cable should be completely attached to the computer.
- Check the monitor and your display card with respect to compatibility and recommended signal timings.
- If your text is garbled, change the video mode to non-interlace and use 60Hz refresh rate.
- If the image of 3840 x 2160 resolution is noisy, unstable or there is no video, please change DP EDID SOUND SELECT in Advanced OSD menu Tag8 or DISPLAYPORT in Advanced OSD menu Tag9.

LED on monitor is not lit (*no green, blue or amber color can be seen*)

- Power Switch should be in the ON position and power cord should be connected.
- Increase LED BRIGHTNESS adjustment.

Picture is not as bright

- Make sure ECO MODE and AUTO BRIGHTNESS are turned off.
- If the brightness fluctuates make sure AUTO BRIGHTNESS is turned off.
- In PICTURE MODE, set HIGH BRIGHT. See page 19.
- LCD brightness degradation occurs due to long-term usage or extreme cold conditions.
- When the display cannot achieve the desired brightness, the numerical brightness value on the OSD will blink.
- When using an HDMI input, please change "VIDEO LEVEL".

Display image is not sized properly

- Use the OSD Image Adjust controls to increase or decrease the Coarse adjustment.
- Check to make sure that a supported mode has been selected on the display card or system being used. (Please consult display card or system manual to change graphics mode.)
- When using an HDMI input, please change "OVER SCAN".
- Adjust H.RESOLUTION or V.RESOLUTION in Tag5 advanced OSD menu.

No Video

- If no video is present on the screen, turn the Power button off and on again.
- Make certain the computer is not in a power-saving mode (touch the keyboard or mouse).
- Some display cards do not output video signal when monitor is turned OFF/ON or disconnect/connect from the AC power cord under low resolution with DisplayPort.
- When using an HDMI input, please change "OVER SCAN".

No Sound

- Check to see if mute is activated.
- Check the volume in the OSD menu.

Brightness variations over time

- Change AUTO BRIGHTNESS to OFF and adjust brightness.

NOTE: When AUTO BRIGHTNESS is set to ON, the monitor automatically adjusts brightness based on the environment. When the brightness of surrounding environment changes, the monitor will also change.

Self Diagnosis

- The LCD display is equipped with the ability to self diagnose abnormalities. When the LCD detects a problem, the LED on the front flashes in a pattern of long and short blinks, depending on the type of problem detected.
- If the LED signals a problem, please refer to qualified personnel for service.

USB Hub does not operate

- Check to make sure the USB cord is properly connected. Refer to your USB device User's Manual.
- Make sure correct upstream is selected on USB hub setting (see page 16).
- Disconnect one upstream USB cable when using 2 upstream connections.
- Turn the Power button off and on again.

No picture in setting with OPTION

- When the half of monitor is black out, check the setting of SLOT2 CH SETTING (see page 25) and the dip switch on the HDMI and DisplayPort Input Card (see page 12). Both setting should be same.
- Depending the option board which you use, some combinations in PBP setting may not be available (see page 16).
- Depending the option board which you use, OSD menu may not be available.

Using the Auto Brightness function

The brightness of the LCD screen can be set to increase or decrease depending on the amount of ambient light within the room. If the room is bright, the monitor becomes correspondingly bright. If the room is dim, then the monitor will dim accordingly. The purpose of this function is to make the viewing experience more comfortable to the eye in a variety of lighting conditions.

SETUP

Use the following procedures to select the Brightness Range that the monitor will use when the Auto Brightness function is activated.

1. Set the BRIGHTNESS level. This is the brightness level that the monitor will go up to when the ambient light level is highest. Select this setting when the room is at its brightest.

Select “ON” in the AUTO BRIGHTNESS menu (**Figure 1**). Then use the front buttons to move the cursor up to the BRIGHTNESS setting. Choose the desired brightness level (**Figure 2**).

2. Set the DARK level. This is the level of brightness that the monitor will go down to when the ambient light level is low. Make sure the room is at its darkest when setting this level.

Then use the front buttons to move the cursor up to the BRIGHTNESS setting. Choose the desired brightness level (**Figure 3**).

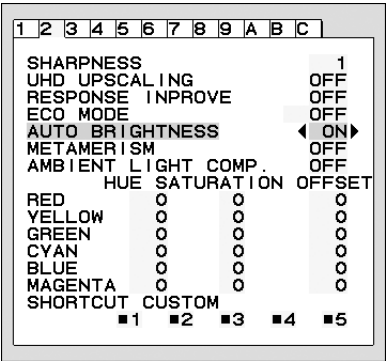

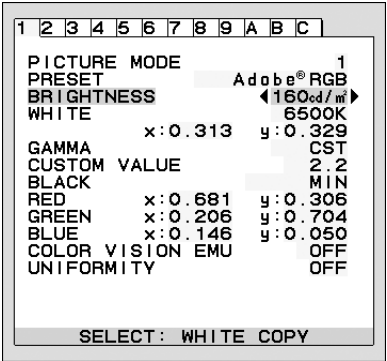

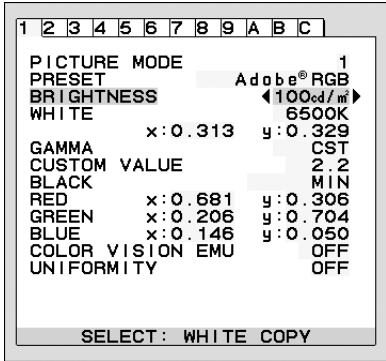

When the “AUTO BRIGHTNESS” function is enabled the Brightness level of the screen changes automatically according to the lighting conditions of the room (**Figure 4**).

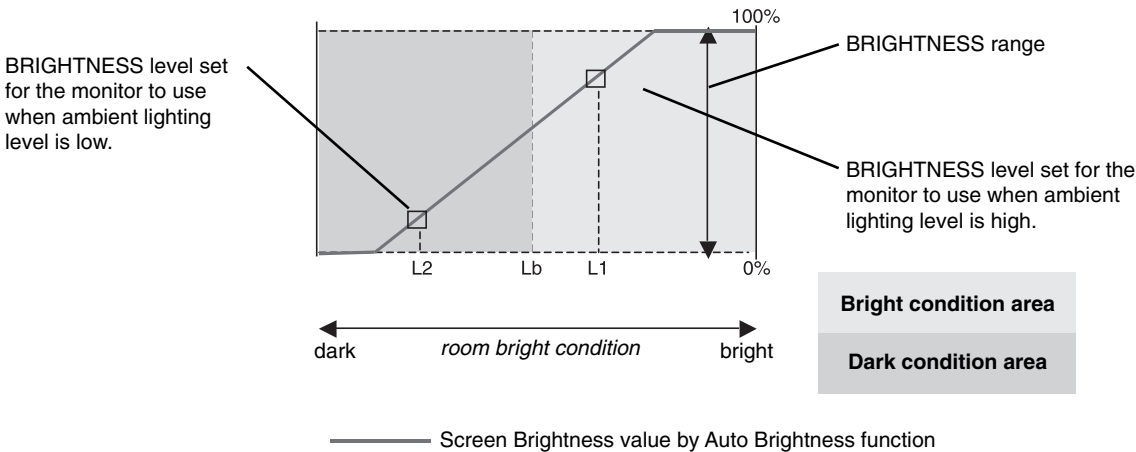

Lb: Border between bright and dim lighting conditions; set at factory
L1: BRIGHTNESS level set for the monitor to use when ambient lighting level is high ($L1 > Lb$)
L2: BRIGHTNESS level set for the monitor to use when ambient lighting level is low ($L2 < Lb$)

L1 and L2 are the brightness levels set by the user to compensate for changes in ambient lighting.

Self Calibration

Simply connect the external USB color sensor, and re-calibrate the factory settings without the need of a computer. This feature is to compensate for a yellow color shift that typically occurs with long-term LCD usage. All PICTURE MODES are updated when Self Calibration is performed.

Before proper self calibration can be performed, display should warm-up for a minimum 30 minutes. If this calibration is started before the monitor is warmed up, a warning will appear on-screen (**Figure S.2**).

NOTE: Stand-alone calibration can only be performed using the MDSVSENSOR3.
Refer to the KEY MAP (**Figure A**) when changing settings during the calibration.
Calibration can be performed in either portrait or landscape orientation.

NOTE: You can start calibration without computer as following.
When there is "NO SIGNAL" menu, press "LEFT", then "RIGHT" button and hold down simultaneously. All White Pattern Image will be displayed. After this, Plug-in the USB color sensor to the side (or bottom when Portrait orientation) USB downstream port. You can start Self Calibration from step number 4.

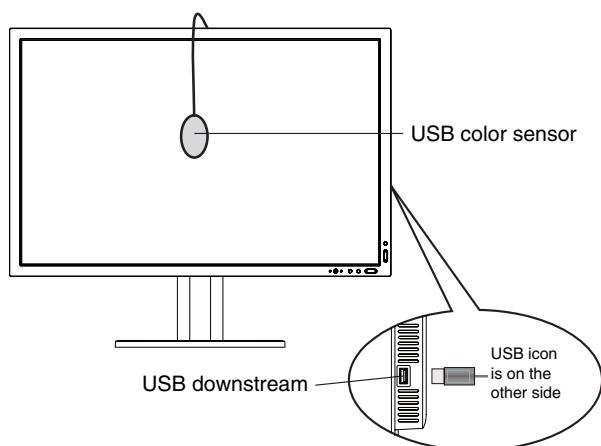

1. Select STAND-ALONE CALIBRATION in Tag B in Advanced OSD menu.
2. Unplug the USB equipment from the side (or bottom when Portrait orientation) USB downstream port and press "SELECT".
3. Plug-in the USB color sensor to the side (or bottom when Portrait orientation) USB downstream port (**Figure S.1**).
4. The calibration menu will open and the sensor will begin to initialize.

5. Use "LEFT" or "RIGHT" to select SELF in the MODE selection. Press "UP" or "DOWN" to move to the next selection.

Press "SELECT" to start the calibration. Stand-alone calibration may take several minutes depending on user settings.

7. After the CALIBRATION SUCCEEDED message appears (**Figure S.4**), press SELECT.
8. To end the calibration mode, press "EXIT".

White Point Matching/Copy

The white point can be copied from one display to one or more additional displays. Using this feature reduces the variation between different displays allowing them to match each other more closely.

White Point Matching/Copy does not compensate for a typical yellow color shift due to long-term LCD usage. If this yellow shift is noticeable, please do Self Calibration. See page 33.

NOTE: Stand-alone calibration can only be performed using the MDSVSENSOR3. Refer to the KEY MAP (**Figure A**) when changing settings during the calibration. Calibration can be performed in either portrait or landscape orientation.

NOTE: You can start calibration without computer as following. When there is "NO SIGNAL" menu, press "LEFT", then "RIGHT" button and hold down simultaneously. All White Pattern Image will be displayed. After this, Plug-in the USB color sensor to the side (or bottom when Portrait orientation) USB downstream port. You can start Copy from step number 4.

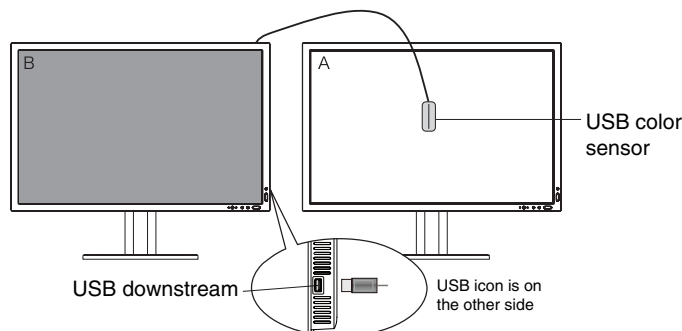

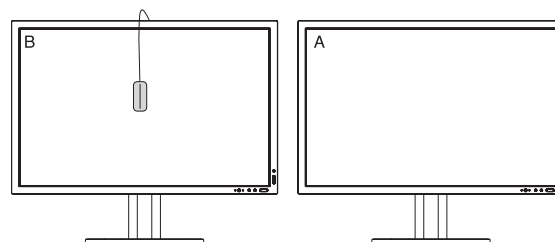

1. Set the target white color on Display A. For example, change the wallpaper to a plain white background or use an application to display a white screen such as the editing screen of a word processor.
2. Using "LEFT" or "RIGHT" of Display B, select COPY in the MODE selection (**Figure C.3**).
3. Select the PICTURE MODE of Display B.
4. The procedure will ask for the USB color sensor to be placed on the center of the display panel (**Figure C.4**). Tilt the display panel approximately 5° backward and place the USB color sensor in the center of the display panel (**Figure C.1**).

NOTE: Place the USB color sensor flat against the display to avoid external light contamination. **Do not** press the USB color sensor against the display panel. Press "SELECT".

5. Press SELECT on Display B to start measuring the white point of Display A.
6. After copying Display A information, the target luminance will be stored and displayed in the OSD of Display B. The white points of Display A and Display B should match. Press SELECT if the copy result is satisfactory. If the copy result is unsatisfactory, press "RESET".
7. When you want to confirm the white point of Display B, remove USB color sensor from source Display A and place in the center of Display B (**Figure C.2**). To skip the white point confirmation, Display B, press "SELECT" to step 9 for FINE TUNING.

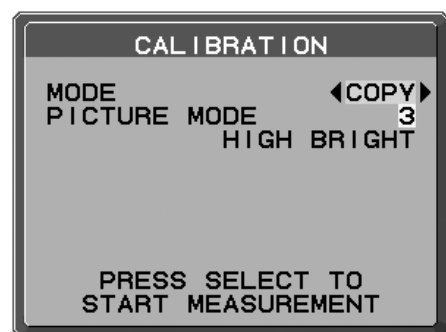

8. Press SELECT to start the confirmation of white point.
9. After the confirmation is finished, FINE TUNING MODE message appears.
10. At the FINE TUNING MODE message (**Figure C.6**), press SELECT if the copy result is satisfactory. If the copy result is unsatisfactory, manually fine tune the white point using the “LEFT” and “RIGHT” buttons, and press SELECT.
11. To end the calibration mode, press “EXIT”.
